The care of insane persons is governed by Provincial enaot-
is and regilations in every Province and this Department does
cesire to make any special regulations in respect to insene houns. Wher an Indian is suspected of being insane, the following

1. The matter is to be reported to the Indian Agent.
2. The Indian Agent shall inform himself as to the correct pro-
cedure in his province and shall act accordingly.
3. If it is found necessary to admit the Indian to an asylum, the Indign Agent shall provide for the expenses of his journey and $\in S C O=$, collect all accounts for services in connection with the examination, commitment, transportation ara ceont and renciol them to the Department in the usual manner.
4. The Indian Agent shall report the date of the patient's arrival at the Asylum having done so, his responsibility ceases.

The Indian Agent may make such other report or ask for sush dinoction in the matter as he deems necessary, but he is not t? del:y a juocedure over which the Department has no real authority or contru?.

## (Part ll.)

The Superintendent of the Asylum is requested to act as follows:

1. To report to the Department the date of the arrival of an insane Indian at his institution.
2. To render monthly, quarterly, or annual accounts for the maintenance of all Insane Indians under his charge. These accomnts should be sent directly to the Department at cttava eitror by the Superintendent or by his superior Provincial Officer.
This Department appreciates receiving accounts on stationèry provided for the purpose and which is available on request.
3. Any necessary disbursements should be entered in the regular acaount and must be supported by receipts. Expenditures for clutiling, surgical operations and dental services should, as a Beneral rule, be authorized by the Department in advence.
4. Accounts are required to reach the Department in three cooies and to be certified by the Superintendent of the institution.
When the patient is discharged, allowed to go home on probation or, otherwise allowed away from the institution, the suporintondent is requested to inform the Department of the exaut date of his leaving.
