MEMORANDUM

The Honourable the Superintendent General -

Referring to memorandum from your office of June 13th with enclosed copy of letter from Mr. H. M. Cassidy, I may say that Mr. Cassidy called on me and submitted the request, as contained in his letter, that the rate for the care of insame Indian patients should be raised from \$1.00 to \$1.50 per day; this rate to represent the actual cost plus a fair allowance for capital charges.

There are at the present time 138 Indians in mental hospitals as follows :
